RAIL NEWS

<u>BARTA</u> officials have announced that funding is in place to restore the 80-year old Franklin Street Station. BARTA already had \$2.6 million for the project and recently secured an additional \$2 million from the state. Abandoned since 1981, the station will require a near-total makeover. BARTA hopes to use the station for public buses to and from neighboring counties.

<u>Ex-C&O 4-8-4 #614</u>, which was stored at the R&N's facilities in Port Clinton since 2000, was moved to the Reading yards on January 12th, heading for Roanoke, VA. On the 13th, NS movement #069, with NS #8792, picked up the #614 (with auxiliary tender) and headed for Hagerstown with a 25mph speed restriction. It spent all day Friday at Vardo yard, moving on to Roanoke on Saturday the 15th. The locomotive will go to the East End Shops in preparation for its movement to the shed at the Virginia Museum of Transportation in the next few weeks, joining the #1218 and #611.

Amtrak has opened a new and larger <u>AutoTrain station at Sanford, Florida</u>, replacing the former depot constructed in 1971 and renovated in 1995. The new station seats nearly 600 passengers and is approx. 10,000 sq. ft. in size. It contains a larger passenger lounge, ticket counter, café, restrooms, and of course, a gift shop. Part of the old station will be turned into administrative offices to be completed early this year. Ridership on the AutoTrain has increased each year for the last five years. Amtrak ridership increased nearly 37% since 2000 – setting a ridership record of 28,716,857 passengers for the fiscal year ending Sept. 30, 2010 and collecting a record \$1.74 billion in ticket revenue.

Last April, Amtrak and the Oklahoma DOT launched a one-year test of a <u>bio-diesel fueled GE P32-8</u> locomotive on the Hearthland Flyer route between Oklahoma City and Fort Worth, TX. The locomotive uses a

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bio-diesel blend known as B20, which contains 20% bio and 80% regular diesel fuel. At the end of the test year, Amtrak will take detailed measurements on the bio-diesel's impact on the engines parts.

The new Eastern Berks Gateway Railroad has been named as the operator of the 8.6-mile Colebrookdale Spur that runs from Pottstown to Boyertown. The 5-year lease states that Berks County will gradually shift the operating costs to the railroad, with the railroad paying all costs by the end of the lease. If the railroad generates more than \$15,000 in revenue in any quarter, the railroad will pay the county \$4,125 rent. The money will go into a special fund for future repairs. So far, only Drug Plastics & Glass Co, in Boyertown, is the only customer. Boyertown Borough Council has agreed to lease 1/3 of the former East Penn Railroad yard, a 2-acre tract at 3rd and Washington Streets, to the new railroad – but not the portion of the yard that contains the antique iron crane, a symbol of Boyertown rail history.

The <u>East Penn Railroad</u> has filed to <u>abandon their "Chester Valley"</u> King of Prussia/Bridgeport line. This is the former-Reading line that crosses over Rt. 202 between KoP and Norristown. Five years ago, public dollars were spent to build a run-around at the NS interchange, but even then the line was serviced only two times a week. The abandonment exemption states that the right-of-way may be suitable for other public use. Current motive power on the line is NIWX SW1500 #2581

<u>CSX</u> has turned over the <u>Lansdale Cluster</u>, on the former Reading Railroad Bethlehem Branch, to the Pennsylvania Northeast Railroad. They will assume trackage right operations of the Lansdale cluster on SEPTA, excluding the Blue Line and Stony Creek Branch.

Norfolk Southern has placed a <u>multi-year order for both GE and EMD units</u>. They will receive (43) GE ES44C units (#8024-8066), plus another (25) ES44C units (#8067-8091) this year. From EMD, they ordered (25) SD70ACE units for 2011 (#1000-1024). For 2012-2014, it is anticipated that NS will order 25 additional locomotives per year from both GE and EMD.

<u>Norfolk Southern</u> has also announced the order of <u>four additional EPA Tier 2</u> compliant high-horsepower repowered <u>locomotives</u> from Progress Rail Services / Caterpillar Inc., designated as PR43C's. Since 2008, NS and Progress Rail have been working with two PR43C's – closely monitoring their performance. The PR43C's have dual engines, a Cat C-175 rated at 3600hp. and a C-18 rated at 700hp, which will work in tandem.
