# RAIL NEWS

A new shortline, dubbed "<u>Lehigh Railroad</u>", has applied to lease 56 miles of the ex-LVRR mainline from Mehoopany to Athens, PA, and trackage rights into Sayre, to interchange with NS. They anticipate handling 2500+ cars per year.

The <u>Pennsylvania Northeast Regional Rail Authority</u> will purchase 10.6 miles of mainline track owned by NS that was originally the Erie Lackawanna mainline between Scranton and the NS interchange at Slateford, PA. Purchase price is \$4.5 million. The PNRRA currently serves more than 25 customers. The purchase will also ensure the continuation of the Steamtown passenger trains from Scranton to the Delaware Water Gap and the Dansbury Depot in East Stroudsburg.

Berks County is the new owner of the 8.6 mile Colebrookdale Spur, which runs from Pottstown to Boyertown. East Penn Lines, LLC, had previously asked \$2.3 million for the line, but agreed to sell for \$1.35 million after Berks County presented an appraisal of the land and scrap value of the rails. The county will hire an operator, seek grants to improve the line, and encourage other businesses to use it. In 2001, the county purchased the line from the state for \$155,000, then sold it to Penn Eastern Lines for \$177,000. East Penn then acquired it from Penn Eastern. Switcher #52 was moved off the line in early April.

The latest word is that the <u>Gettysburg RR</u> has canceled the Pioneer Lines Scenic Railway passenger train for 2009, with possible resumption next year.

NS has installed a Wye track on land formerly occupied by the Bethlehem engine terminal. Previously, locomotives were run to Reading for turning.

The <u>Reading & Northern</u> has their <u>Temple (Tuckerton Rd.) station</u> up for rent. The station was originally moved from Frackville around 1980 and served for many years as the base point for steam and diesel trips to Hamburg. The RCT&HS had a small museum there, but has since moved to their new museum in Hamburg.

The <u>RCT&HS</u> and the Philadelphia Chapter have extended their agreement with the Railroad Museum of PA to allow the <u>FP7's #902 and #903</u> to remain on loan to the museum in Strasburg for another year, with options to renew for up to three years.

It appears that the \$42 million project to relocate NS's Dillerville yard will finally proceed. Site prep equipment has been moved in to the former municipal dump site behind the Post Office on the Harrisburg Pike. Both F&M College, Lancaster General Hospital, and NS have been working on the project for several years, and the Rendell administration has awarded a \$10 million grant to F&M to assist in paying for the project.
