RAIL NEWS

The ex-Reading Colebrookdale Line, which at one time ran some 13 miles from Pottstown to Barto, is in danger of being abandoned and turned into a walking trail. The line began operating in 1869 and was operated by the P&R and Reading Railroads until 1976. Conrail wanted to abandon the line and the state acquired it and hired operators to keep it running. In 2001, Berks County bought it from the state for \$155,000 and hired John Nolan's Penn Eastern Lines to operate it until Nolan sold it to East Penn Railroad, in Kennett Square. One active customer is on the line - Drug Plastics and Glass Co. in Boyertown. They receive resin in covered hoppers which could be offloaded in Pottstown and materials trucked to Boyertown. DP&G claims that one covered hopper would require four truckloads to move the same amount of material. East Penn Railroads attorneys have notified the Berks County commissioners of the company's intent to start abandonment proceedings in June.
