RAIL NEWS

<u>Norfolk Southern</u> and GE Transportation has implemented GE's new "<u>Rail Edge Movement Planner</u>" on a 200 mile section of track in Georgia. The "Rail Edge" integrates railroad logistics with traffic control systems. The technology projects expected track usage, based on train schedules, and then produces an optimized plan to get trains moving faster and more efficiently. It also improves crew management. NS hopes to have the program operational in it entire 22 state rail network by 2012.

Norfolk Southern is in negotiations with the <u>Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum</u> with regards to the operation of a limited schedule of steam event and passenger excursions beginning late this year. The event, dubbed "21st Century Steam", would feature three coal-powered steam locomotives, including Southern Railway #4501, a Mikado that was retired from regular service in 1963 – later to be run in excursion service from 1966 to 1994. The second locomotive, Southern Railway #630, a consolidation-type, just finished up an extensive six-year rehab to FRA standards in TVRM's shops in Chattanooga. The third is TVRR's #610, a Baldwin Consolidation

type, which was one of the last steamers built in the US. Excursions could possibly take place as early as this fall in the Chattanooga area.

<u>Lionel Electric Trains</u> has announced that they will be making a replica of the Union Pacific #2010, an ES44C that honors the 100th Anniversary of the Boy Scouts of America. The limited edition will be featured in Lionel's 2010 Volume 2 catalog and will be available for the holiday season. For more info, go to www.lionel.com.

<u>Alcelor-Mittal Steelton</u>, the owner of the former Bethlehem Steel mill in Steelton, will invest \$54 million to upgrade its rail production with a new walking beam reheat furnace that will be more energy efficient and environmentally friendly. The new operations are scheduled to start up in 2012. (Railway Track & Structures)

The current owner of the <u>Greenbrier Hotel and Resort</u> will spend nearly \$15 million on a plan to run a <u>steampowered luxury train</u> from Washington, DC, to White Sulphur Springs, W.VA, but would actually use diesel power for the first year or two, beginning in the summer of 2012. The initial plans call for the 17-car ultra-first class train to bring 210 guests from Washington DC to the Greenbrier Resort, departing DC on Tuesday and the arriving in White Sulphur Springs around 5PM. The route of the GBX will be the same as Amtrak's Cardinal. When arriving at WSS, the train would be met by a bevy of ten horse-drawn carriages to take the guests to the hotel. Round trip fare will be \$750 with no childs fare. The GBX will leave WSS on Sunday at 10AM, arriving back at Washington around 5PM. The train will consist of seven parlor cars, two dining cars, kitchen car, open platform tavern-lounge-observation car, plus other special cars including two baggage-generator HEP cars. Service is scheduled to take place July 2, 2012. Ex-Conrail C39-8's (24 year old locomotives) will furnish power for the train. NSSX #8211, #8202, #8207 will be moved from Altoona to Warminster and then to the New Hope & Ivyland for repairs. #8208 and #8212 are also possibilities, but not moved to Warminster. All equipment will be moved to one of the buildings that were the old Bethlehem Steel facility at the east end of Pottstown for repairs/painting.

On June 1, <u>Progress Rail Services Corp.</u> announced an agreement <u>to purchase EMD</u> for \$820 million from Berkshire Partners, LLC, and Greenbrier Equity group. The deal should close by the end of the year. Progress Rail, owned by Caterpillar Corp., would still maintain its La Grange, IL, headquarters.
